She will need structure, stability, and an experienced caregiver who knows how to handle her manipulative behaviors.

Savannah receives extra help in school due to being on an IEP, but is mainstreamed into regular classes. Savannah does not enjoy doing homework and often misplaces her assignments. She has the intelligence to succeed, but needs strong encouragement and supervision in her school work.
